The mission of the Pride Center of Terre Haute is to serve the LGBTQIAP2S+ community, questioning individuals, and allies in the Wabash Valley through the provision of supportive programs, services, resources, education, and advocacy within a safe community center space.

We envision an equitable Wabash Valley community where LGBTQIAP2S+ persons can live safely and openly with pride.

Our services include: a community center space located community resource referrals counseling services with Catalyst Counseling & Consulting, support groups, legal name and gender marker change support, a chest binder exchange program, post-surgery care kits, a hygiene closet, LGBTQ+ business advising, educational programs and trainings, community building programs, annual Pride celebrations, and more. In our downtown community center space, we also have games, wifi, queer books, Pride merch, and more!

We are located in downtown Terre Haute at 630 Wabash Avenue. We are open on Thursdays and Fridays from 4-8pm and Saturdays from 12-8pm. 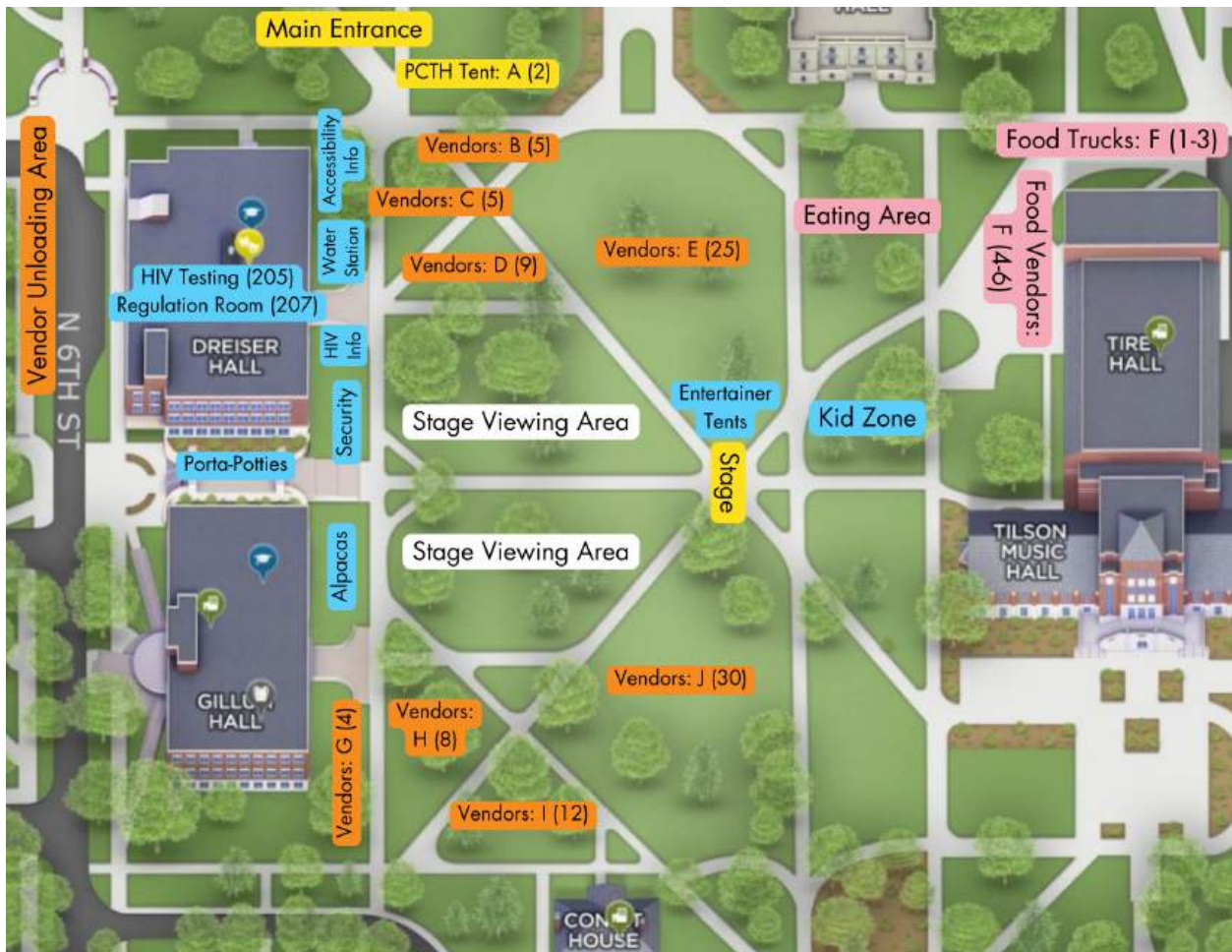


TERRE HAUTE PRIDE FEST LOGISTICS

DATE, TIME, & LOCATION: Terre Haute Pride Fest will take place Saturday, September 21 from 3:00pm-8:00pm at Indiana State University on the Quad.

The Quad is the large park space on the President's Lawn and surrounded by Dreiser, Gillum, Normal, and Tirey Halls. [This is not to be confused with the open space where Lincoln Quad was previously located.] The map below provides locations for Terre Haute Pride Fest! The event entrance is closest to the fountain.

The best address to enter into your GPS is for Dreiser Hall: 221 N 6th St, Terre Haute, IN 47809. The event entrance will be to the north of the building.





LOGISTICS

WHAT TO BRING: We suggest bringing a chair or blanket to sit in front of the entertainment stage, money for any purchases at our vendor booths, and your friends and family! (Sunscreen is also always a good idea.)

PARKING: Free attendee parking is available in any [Indiana State University lot](#) and downtown street parking. Paid parking is available in parking garages. Parking areas you may consider are: Lots 5 and 10 (Cherry and 5th Street), Lot 14 (right off 3rd Street), ISU Parking Garage (701 Cherry St, Terre Haute, IN 47807).

HOW TO ENTER: Please enter the Quad through the event entrance marked by RAINBOWS and purple Pride Center tents. It is closest to Dreiser Hall near the ISU fountain at 221 N 6th St, Terre Haute, IN 47809. The event is FREE for all attendees!

WRISTBANDS: All attendees must wear a wristband provided by Pride Fest volunteers at the event entrance to enter and participate in the event.

ESSENTIALS

FOOD & DRINKS: There will be six food and drink vendors to enjoy: FRYE'D, Kintner's Concessions, The Mixed Plate, Black Cat Confections, Cloud Nine Macarons, and Zesty Besties.

WATER: A hydration station will be located in front of Dreiser Hall. We request a donation to help fund the Pride Center!

RESTROOMS: Portable restrooms will be available between Gillum and Dreiser Halls near the event. Additional restrooms are located in Dreiser Hall and Hulman Memorial Student Union.

SEATING: There is seating available in the eating area near our food vendors, and there are various benches across the Quad. You can bring chairs and blankets for the stage viewing area.

PETS: Pets are so welcome! Please be sure they are leashed. If your pet needs to use the restroom, please take them outside the event area, and please collect and dispose of any waste.

ACCESSIBILITY: Entrances to the event are mobility devices accessible. We will have an accessibility booth outside of Dreiser Hall and a Regulation Room inside Dreiser Hall (room 207) to meet various needs. There are quiet areas outside of the event space and inside Dreiser Hall. If you need a break away, feel free to come back and enjoy the fun whenever you want!



ENTERTAINMENT

KID-FRIENDLY ACTIVITIES: The entire event is family and kid friendly! We will have activities, games, alpacas, prizes, and more!

ENTERTAINMENT: We have 20 amazing performers! Musicians will rock the stage from 3-6pm, the drag show is from 6-7:30pm, and a DJ will play us out from 7:30-8pm!

PERFORMER MEET & GREETS: Some performers may opt to do meet and greets at the entertainment tent beside the stage!

PERFORMER TIPS: We will have tip boxes on the stage for each performer for cash tips. If you don't have cash, a majority of the performers accept electronic tips. A QR code will be posted on the Stage Viewing Area signs so you can tip your favorite performers!

POLICIES

All vendors, volunteers, entertainers, and attendees are expected to adhere to the following policies during the event.

WELCOMING ENVIRONMENT: The Terre Haute Pride Fest is a welcoming environment free of bullying, harassment, intimidation, and victimization. The Pride Center of Terre Haute reserves the right to refuse entrance to the event to individuals causing LGBTQ+ persons in Terre Haute, Indiana or the surrounding areas to feel unsafe, unwelcome, or discriminated against.

BE RESPECTFUL: The LGBTQIA+ community is a vast spectrum of identities, and the Pride Fest grounds should be a safe space for each person. Please treat all attendees with respect. Sexism, racism, ableism, ageism, homophobia, fatphobia, transphobia, etc. will not be tolerated and are grounds for immediate dismissal and exclusion from future festivals. Do not touch others without their consent.

BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR: Please respect vendor spaces, our staging, and those around you. Do not impede visibility at the stage or traffic in vending areas. Keep sidewalks clear.

BE PATIENT AND KIND: The Pride Center of Terre Haute and our festival are entirely volunteer powered. Everyone is doing their best to make the best day possible for you and festival goers. Bullying attendees or festival staff will not be tolerated.

HARMLESS FOR ANY LOSSES: Attendees understand that the Pride Center of Terre Haute Inc. has no control over weather, acts of God, acts of terrorism, government intervention, or any other cause that may prevent and alter and or interrupt the Terre Haute Pride Fest, and participants shall hold the Pride Center of Terre Haute Inc. harmless for any losses that could arise because of such event.

NO OFFENSIVE MATERIALS: All materials deemed offensive by the Pride Center of Terre Haute Inc. will not be permitted to be sold or displayed.

CONDUCT: All attendees are expected to monitor themselves on all matters of conduct, attire, etc. This is a family-friendly community event and minors will be present.



SAFETY

The Indiana State University Police Department will provide security for the event and will staff a security services booth by Dreiser Hall. Information regarding safety procedures are below.

WEATHER: Terre Haute Pride Fest will take place rain or shine. In the event of a thunderstorm with lightning or tornado, we will ask all vendors and attendees to seek shelter. Once the weather clears, we will resume the festivities. Severe Weather Action Plan:

- ISU Police Department Officers, as well as ISU Police Dispatch, will monitor weather conditions and any potential weather alerts.
- General Thunderstorm Threats Including Lightning: Terre Haute Pride will check the daily weather forecast to see if thunderstorms are in the forecast. Terre Haute Pride, as well as ISU Police, will periodically scan the sky for signs of developing conditions. If signs of developing conditions are seen, the Festival Director and/or ISU Police will notify all individuals via the PA system. If thunder is heard and/or lightning is seen, activities will be delayed immediately. All individuals will be instructed to move indoors or to their vehicles. Additionally, the 30-30 Rule for Lightning Safety will be observed, if it takes less than 30 seconds to hear thunder, lightning is close enough to pose a threat. After the storm ends, there will be a wait of 30 minutes before resuming activities.
- Strong Winds Conditions: Should wind conditions reach 20 mph, all portable tents will be evacuated, as they are not wind rated.
- Tornado Watch/Warning: Outdoors activities will be postponed, and the event grounds evacuated. Weather conditions will be monitored using Terre Haute Pride Fest volunteers as well as ISU Police/Dispatch.

THREAT OF VIOLENCE: We have a policy to treat all threats and rumors of violence as real. Attendees are encouraged to communicate if they feel they are in danger of bodily harm or consider a threat to be immediate to the nearest ISU Police Officer, the security booth, volunteer, or call 911. If on campus, please dial 812-237-5555 to reach ISU Police Dispatch.

- If any safety or security hazards present themselves, individuals are also encouraged to notify staff or ISU Police.
- In some threatening situations, the PA system may be used to give instructions to attendees to remain calm and to evacuate.



SAFETY

MEDICAL EMERGENCY: Immediately contact a member of ISU Police detailed to the event.

EVACUATION PROCEDURES: In the event of a necessary evacuation, attendees will be instructed to vacate the area via the PA system to nearby buildings or their vehicles. In the event of severe weather, individuals are encouraged to seek shelter in nearby buildings or their vehicles. Clear instructions will be provided over the PA system.

BUILDINGS AND CONTACTS FOR SHELTER: In the event of severe weather or a general need for evacuation, the following buildings will be utilized; Hulman Memorial Student Union, Dreiser Hall, Gillum Hall, Tilson Hall, and the Technology Building.

TOBACCO AND ALCOHOL: Indiana State University is a tobacco/smoke/vape free campus. In addition, alcoholic beverages are not permitted at this event.

NO NUDDITY: While we do not want to limit self-expression, the local laws and policies need to be followed. We ask you to observe the simple rule of swimsuit covering. If you can wear it to a public pool, you are good to go.

PERSONAL ITEMS ARE PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY: You are solely responsible for your personal items, including the items left in unattended tents. You assume all risk of their loss or damage.

NO FIREWORKS, FLARES, OR FIREARMS: Weapons, including firearms and ammunition, of any kind are not permitted. Fireworks and flares are also not permitted. Other items not permitted include: illegal drugs, open flames, grills or cooking of any kind, bicycles, ATVs, scooters, or motorcycles.

ADDITIONAL PROCEDURES: Please review Indiana State University's *WHAT TO DO IN AN EMERGENCY* guide for additional information relating to fire emergencies, active shooters, medical emergencies, suspicious activity, power outages, hazardous materials, tornados, and natural gas leaks.

WHAT TO DO IN AN EMERGENCY

Fire Emergency EVACUATE

- Activate nearest fire alarm.
- Proceed to nearest exit.
- Use stairs, not elevators
- Assist those in need.
- Meet at assembly areas
- Stay away from building

Active Shooter RUN, HIDE, FIGHT

- If you can safely leave, RUN.
- If unsafe to leave, seek immediate protection and HIDE.
- Stay away from doors and windows.

Medical Emergency STAY CLEAR

- If trained, administer First Aid/CPR/AED.
- If not trained, stay clear of area.
- Direct first responders to incident location.

Suspicious Activity REPORT

- Always report unusual activity to ISU Police.
- Open locked doors for authorized people only.
- Do not touch unknown/suspicious packages.
- Secure belongings.
- Stay vigilant of your surroundings.

Be Prepared

EMERGENCY

911

Remain Calm
ISU Police Dept.

Power Outage EVALUATE

- Contact Public Safety
- If people are trapped in elevator, do not pry doors.
- Isolate hazardous areas to prevent harm, leave building if appropriate.
- Re-enter only when told by authorities.

Hazardous Materials FOLLOW DIRECTION

- Alert people near spill.
- Avoid breathing vapors.
- Do not attempt to clean up the materials.
- Follow instructions from Public Safety.
- Be aware of railroad emergencies.

Tornado SEEK SHELTER

- Close all doors.
- Move to lowest interior space of building away from windows or glass.
- Crouch near floor under a heavily supported item.

Natural Gas Leak MOVE AWAY

- Leave area immediately.
- Do not operate any electrical device (phone, appliances, etc)
- Do not try to locate source of gas leak.
- Contact Public Safety when at a safe location.
